

HOLY TRINITY CHURCH, ASHFORD-IN-THE-WATER: TIMELINE

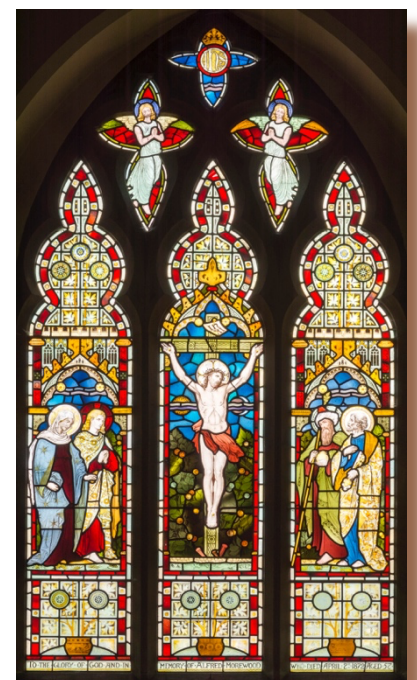
- Probably a church here in Saxon times (?)
- 1100 **Norman tympanum** (interior south entrance)
Norman corbels (north chancel wall)
- 1200 Tower
A chantry founded here (1257) by Griffin, son of the Welsh chieftain Wenunwyn
- 1300 Tower battlements
North aisle
Font (now with a modern base)
- 1400 Tower arch
- 1500 Small "sanctus" bell over sanctuary (now in tower)
Octagonal pillars and arches
- 1600 4th and tenor bells (1612)
- 1700 Coat of arms of George I (1724)
5th bell (1750)
Oldest **maiden's garland** (1797)
- 1800 Renovations (1837 – 1850) by Revd William Galley Giles
Vestry added
Triple-decker pulpit replaced with present pulpit, using panels from Jacobean furniture (ca. 1620)
- 1850 Restoration (1868 – 1870) by Revd John Reddaway Luxmoore
Walls and roof replaced
New floors (incl. Minton tile installation) and sub-floor heating
Chancel enlarged; altar elevated
Box pews replaced with present pews
West gallery removed
New south porch erected
Font recovered from local garden and re-installed
Three **stained-glass windows** installed
- 1900 Organ, J Housely Adkins (1926)
Organ blower (1946)
- 1950 "Tinsley" stained-glass window (1953)
3rd bell (1954)
4th, 5th and tenor bells re-cast (1954)
- 1960 "Mary" stained-glass window (1960)
Treble and 2nd bells (1966)
Organ re-built and enlarged, Henry Willis (1966)
- 1980 Organ enlarged (1983)
- 2000 "Olivier" stained-glass window (2001)
